Reasons for an appeal are limited to:

- Evidence that appropriate adjudication procedures were not followed which may have a bearing on the initial response.
- New information that was not available at the time of the original inquiry which may have a bearing on the initial decision(s).
- Evidence the inquiry officer(s) could not have reached a decision(s) about responsibility and/or sanctions absent bias.

Information regarding the appeal process can be found in the Spartan Virtues (Student Handbook).

In addition to the community accountability outcome, students who represent units within the university community, which may include but is not limited to nursing, students, honors students, graduate students, student athletes, and residential students might be subject to additional behavioral consequences under the standards set by those units.

My genuine concern is for your academic well-being and success during your time here at Missouri Baptist University. It is my hope that these consequences will encourage you to reflect on this incident, and that you will begin to process how you can make better decisions to avoid similar situations in the future.
