## DIRECTOR'S NOTE

There is no musical that my dad and I have bonded more over than *Fiddler* on the Roof. It was the first musical I ever did as a sophomore in high school, and we were both hooked from then on out. We love the characters and the music, but what we really love is that it is a show we can talk about together and continuously find something new about which we can think deeply and learn.

*Fiddler on the Roof* is a favorite and a classic for many, many reasons. Nostalgia, the appeal to family and community traditions, "To Life," "Sunrise, Sunset," and many other beautiful themes and songs throughout the show.

But at its core, *Fiddler on the Roof* is a musical about a community of people who, through their traditions, stay connected, grounded, and joyful in the face of antisemitism and persecution.

What we see depicted in *Fiddler* is a small taste of what Russian Jews actually endured under turn-of-the-century Russian rule. Robert Weinberg wrote in "Pogroms: Anti-Jewish Violence in Modern Russian History," "In the port of Odessa alone, the police reported that at least 400 Jews and 100 non-Jews were killed." This was only one of many pogroms carried out in Russia in 1905.

Now we are seeing anti-Jewish sentiments and violence increase as the war in the Gaza strip rages on. Since 2021, Missouri alone has seen a 100% increase in antisemitic incidents. On Monday a woman in Indiana purposefully crashed her car into a school she mistakenly thought was Jewish. On October 31, FBI Director Christopher Wray said that antisemitic hate crimes are reaching historic levels.

I believe that the greatest pieces of theatre hold space for the fullest expressions of human emotions. In the Golden age cannon, not many musicals attain this in the same way that *Fiddler* does. As Tevye exclaims in one song, "God would like us to be joyful even when our hearts lie panting on the floor." The musical invites us to do the same, while also spurring us to action to fight antisemitism and all kinds of racism wherever it may be.

I hope our production of *Fiddler on the Roof* brings you incredible joy, nostalgia, and a sense of the musical theatre tradition that connects us all. And I also hope that it makes you think and grow and engage with the world to change it for the better.

Thank you for making us a part of your theatre tradition.


