

## Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund – Student Fund Reporting Disclosure

Schools receiving funding from Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund established under the CARES Act and subsequently supplemented by the CRRSAA and ARP are required to report information describing the use of these funds to the Secretary of Education.

  - a. MBU received \$5,872,423 in funding through the ARP Act. Of this amount, at least \$2,956,510 will be used for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

  - a. Initial Report: As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021, MBU awarded \$0 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students from the HEERF funding allocated by ARP.
