#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In 1900, 1.75 million American children under the age of 15 worked, often for poverty-wages and in unsafe working conditions (census.gov). These children laundered and sewed clothes in their homes, made their living in slaughterhouses, and often were sent into machinery if there was a mechanical failure because they were small enough to fit where a grown man could not (Children of the City). And, of course, they hawked newspapers on the streets, one penny per pape.

When Willian Randolph Hearst and Joseph Pulitzer refused to lower the price of papers after the Spanish-American War had ended, the newsboys began the largest child-led strike in history. Hundreds of newsboys refused to sell papers.

And they won.

Newsies is a high-energy, fun, joyful piece of musical theatre, but it is also a slice of history. It reminds us that when people, even children as young as five years old, band together for a common good their voices can overwhelm the most powerful people. It calls for us to "bring justice to the oppressed and poor (Proverbs 31:9)" and to "loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke (Isaiah 58:6-7)."

I hope that tonight you find this production cathartic and hope-bringing. I also hope that it inspires you to look for the injustices around you and side with the oppressed. And if you are a Christ-follower, I hope that it makes you look a little more like Jesus.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."




